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## Did You Know?...

St. Rita School for the Deaf is the only school in the country of its kind — a school with both day and residential programs for deaf, hard of hearing, and children with special communication needs ages six weeks through twelfth grade. In our mixed school environment of 184 students, 75% of our students have other diagnosed disabilities, ranging from sensory to physical.



## School is like Christmas for one student



A battle with a brain tumor and other challenges, left Stevie with no language at 8 years old. Awaiting an official diagnosis, his family searched for ways to help Stevie learn and grow. For four years, he received intensive services in his home in Michigan. For hours each day, family and professionals worked to teach him sign language and give him an education. Academically he began to grow, but his demanding one on one instruction schedule left little time for social skills and playmates.

Then, his family discovered St. Rita School. Since the school year began, Stevie leaves his family in Michigan to

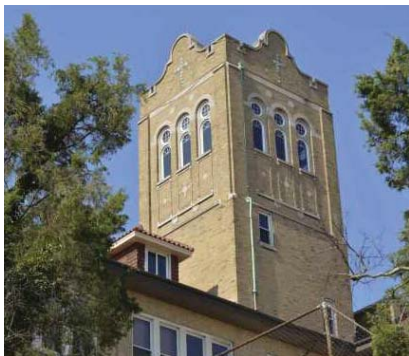
# Giving a child a chance to dream

Viola began attending St. Rita School at 12 years old. Being deaf in one ear and severely hard-of-hearing in the other, she was struggling to keep up with her classmates in her local school in Michigan. Her mother, Tiffany, wrote a letter describing the difference she saw in her daughter after only a few months at St. Rita School:

*It's impossible for anyone who didn't see the "before" and "after" Viola to fully understand the impact attending St. Rita's has had on her academics, emotions and social skills.*

We started to think the mainstreamed program Viola was a part of in Michigan was no longer meeting her needs. We were seeing issues with Viola's behavior. She was becoming the class clown and was being picked on a bit on the playground because of her hearing loss. Viola felt very isolated and she was struggling to be in the 2nd percentile for her grade level.

Viola was spending lots of time in the evenings trying to read to keep up with her 3 hearing sisters as well as classmates. She would check books out from the library but the vocabulary was totally lost on her. I discovered a notebook where she'd been keeping lists of words she didn't know and was looking them up at night. It broke my heart that someone who wanted so desperately to learn was being prevented from learning because of the way her program was set up. She needed more intense teaching that would address her academic as well as her emotional needs. She was falling behind fast.



St. Rita School is a 204 mile drive one way from our home—so about 3–3½ hours one way. He [Chris, Tiffany's husband] didn't want her to move away. It was



too hard for him to think of letting his 12 year old move away. But we both saw she was falling still more behind and in February he said we could schedule a March visit. As soon as we came we knew this would be her school. We had already been impressed with the academics and the results of the school, but Viola loved it and we saw the change immediately. All of us were crying, but one by one each of us agreed that, if Viola wanted to go to St. Rita's we wouldn't prevent her. We asked her and she said, "Yes!"

That week already I saw a difference. People may think I'm exaggerating, but I'm not. When she came home on her last day at the local school she was telling me about the behavior of each child and what she ate for lunch. On the way home after those first 3 days at St. Rita School she told me about her teacher, what she was

# Awakening souls and setting them free

Do you remember reading the story of Helen Keller? She had lost her hearing and her sight shortly before age 2 after becoming ill with Scarlet Fever. When she was 6½ years old her parents hired Annie Sullivan to be her teacher. Sullivan worked with Helen for several months—signing and spelling into her hand with no success, until finally, on what was to be their last day together, they stopped at the water pump on the way to the house. Annie pumped the water out and then spelled the word in Helen’s hand as she had done many times before. But this time something quite different happened. Here is how Helen described this experience in her own words:

*“Suddenly I felt a misty consciousness as of something forgotten—a thrill of returning thought; and somehow the mystery of language was revealed to me. I knew then that “w-a-t-e-r” meant the wonderful cool*

*something that was flowing over my hand. That living word awakened my soul, gave it light, hope, joy, set it free! ... Everything had a name, and each name gave birth to a new thought. As we returned to the house every object which I touched seemed to quiver with life.”*

As a young girl Helen Keller seemed a hopeless case of a child with a disability that she could never possibly overcome. But when God brought her together with a teacher who believed she could, a whole new world opened up for Helen. She grew up to be an amazing woman who accomplished more good in her lifetime than most of us even dream of doing!

We believe every child has a God given potential, but not every

parent can afford to hire an Annie Sullivan to draw it out. Here at St. Rita School we see the “mystery of language” revealed every day. In the Total Communication environment of St. Rita School we have an outstanding team of ‘Annie Sullivans’ who are “...awakening souls and setting them free...” just as Helen Keller herself described!

reading, and the subjects she was studying. Then she said, “Mommy, you know atmosphere have [sic] levels?” I was dumbfounded. She didn’t know the word ‘atmosphere’ before. I told her I did know the levels and she told me about her favorite, “The ionosphere”. Then she described it. In under 8 weeks Viola was learning what fractions were and was accurately adding them and finding common denominators. Things I’d tried to do for years.

Her academics are soaring. I don’t have the angry outbursts and nightly crying fits where she insists she can’t do her work and I desperately try to figure out a way to explain it. Viola has learned so much vocabulary that when we sign or speak we can have a conversation and she understands my explanation—or at least understands that I’m trying to help her.

Viola loves being in Chess Club and Volleyball. She likes the outings and lunch chatter. She even told me the Easter Story last spring, which is great since I’ve tried to explain it to her many times to no avail.

At home Viola has about 18 cats outside, there are 2 ducks, a pet sheep, Sammy, and our dog Bailey. When she comes home on the weekends she misses them. She likes to come to her room and play games with her sisters. She volunteers in the nursery at church on Saturday nights and is involved in 4H, but during the week she gets to be herself too. St. Rita’s gives her that chance.

All of last year we left our house at 11 in the morning to be there in time for her to get out of school at 2:45pm. We would jump right back in the car and drive home getting home around 6:30pm–7pm most nights. On Sundays we left at 3pm to get her to the dorm and got home about 10:30–11pm. My husband or I made the trips every week. With the ridiculous winter we had I had more than a

few trips that were 10 hours or longer round trip. Her education is worth it.

I have always known that my kids were on loan to me from God. I didn’t realize how short the loan would be with Viola. No one expects to send their 12 year old “off to college” and we cried when we left, but it is impossible for anyone who didn’t see the “before” and “after” of Viola’s life to fully understand the impact of attending St. Rita’s has had on her academically, socially and emotionally.

I guess the most telling thing is when people used to ask my 4 girls, “What do you want to be when you grow up?” Caitie, the oldest, would say, “A forensic scientist and novelist.” Kelsey would say, “A pediatrician who runs a hospital.” Aubrey would say, “An astronaut who goes on lunar missions.” Viola would say, “I don’t know.” She didn’t understand the question. About 6 months after starting St. Rita’s Viola said, “When I grow up I want to be a teacher, teach [sic] deaf kids.” St. Rita’s gave her dreams and helped her understand they existed and that, despite being deaf in one ear and severely hard-of-hearing in the other, they are possible for her too.”

father. “After his second day of school he came home and said it was as good as Christmas. He runs into the school every morning because he loves it. He never did have friends, but on that first day kids came up to him and put their arms around him. I cried. That’s why I’m here.”

*“It’s pretty awesome and it’s only been four weeks.”*

“After a week he was praying at dinner thanking God for his friends. Just a few days in and he’s picking up being prayerful and thankful. It’s pretty awesome and it’s only been four weeks.”

Stevie has now joined the chess club, has played basketball for the first time, and is bonding with kids, both in his own class and in the senior class. “I know he will learn and get an education,” said Steve, “but he had no social life before now and that is what is so important to me right now. The school is really one family. Everyone works together. For him, it’s Christmas right now. We love St. Rita School.”
