Fundraising activities that currently exist like St. Rita Fest are for the primary purpose of providing tuition to students whose families cannot afford it. 99% of our student population needs financial support and more than 40% of children come from families who live below the poverty level. In almost 100 years, we have never turned a child away due to a family's inability to pay.

When Ken and Tracy's son was born, he failed the infant hearing screen due to fluid buildup. By the time Brodie was 2 years old, it was determined that his hearing loss was in fact, a genetic hearing loss condition.

With the help of a few organizations, Ken and Tracy learned how they could help Brodie overcome the challenge he now faced and the options they had for schooling. After deciding that mainstream schools would not be a good fit for their family, they took a tour of St. Rita School. Immediately their family felt at home and Brodie was enrolled in preschool.

Now the whole family is learning sign language and Brodie, despite a recent diagnosis of autism, is exceeding in the classroom each day. At age 6, Brodie is making his parents proud and they believe college will one day be an option because of St. Rita School.

“St. Rita School opened up a new world for Jeremy. Instead of being shy, he is outgoing. He really came out of his shell. There were no more temper tantrums or fights with kids at school.”

Fourteen years ago, as Linda and her husband waited anxiously for their adopted son to be born, they had no idea that he was suffering strokes in utero. When Jeremy was born, he began having seizures. Medication controlled the seizures, but the damage was already done.

“Jeremy was a little slow to hit milestones, but he never babbled as an infant. His speech never came,” said Linda. CT Scans and MRIs showed there was significant damage in the areas of the brain that hold communication. Jeremy was diagnosed with apraxia and doctors said he would never learn to speak.

When he was three, Jeremy started preschool. “He was a lot more frustrated than other children.

He couldn’t tell his side of the story and I would get calls about Jeremy taking a toy from another child or throwing sand at other children,” said Linda.

Then came Linda’s God-send; a speech therapist who recommended St. Rita School. Jeremy was enrolled at St. Rita School and immediately change began to happen. He recognized the power of communication and together with sign language, a speech augmented device and eventually even speech, Jeremy eagerly began to communicate with his world.

“It was like night and day,” said Linda. “It opened up a new world for Jeremy. Instead of being shy, he is outgoing. He really came out of

his shell. There were no more temper tantrums or fights with kids at school.”

But the staff and teachers at St. Rita School did more than bring communication to Jeremy. They were a source of healing when his father lost his battle to cancer. While Linda’s oldest son could receive help from organizations designed to walk children through grief, there were no translators or services available for Jeremy.

“The teachers were so understanding when he came back to school,” said Linda. “He talked to his kindergarten teacher who told him “Daddy is with Jesus.” Later his teacher found him holding a picture he drew to the window. When she asked about it, he said he wanted to show his Daddy his picture.”

“I can’t even imagine life without St. Rita School,” said Linda. “Jeremy would have had a life of isolation. He has excelled not just educationally, but socially. He would never have been able to connect with kids his age, been invited to sleepovers or birthday parties and would have been rejected by other kids.”

“Before St. Rita School, Jeremy would have been very limited. But now in the high school work studies program, Jeremy loves the green house and I can see him pursuing something with horticulture or landscaping. At St. Rita School it is all about the kids. They use any method that works best for each child.”

“Jeremy really is my hero. He does not see himself as disabled, but is happy and loves life.”
