Thanks to your support, a family is forever changed

When Amy and Bryant welcomed their first son into the world, they had no idea the challenges and yet many joys that lay before them. When Gus was 20 months old he was diagnosed with severe apraxia. "He was a quiet baby," said Amy. "He didn't make sounds or babble and we knew something was wrong. He was showing a lot of frustration."

Gus had so much he wanted to say, but did not have the ability to communicate. "It was like going through charades every time he wanted to speak," said Bryant. In order to explain he wanted chips and dip for lunch one day, he pulled a bag of chips out of the cabinet, pointed to the picture of the dip container on the bag, then pulled out the sour cream from the fridge and made gestures about making chip dip. To ex-

plain what movie he wanted to watch, he would reenact scenes with toys.

"We realized he knows so much," said Bryant. "He just couldn't get it out. He would pause and think and you could tell he was trying to come up with a way to tell us something. And if one way didn't work he would think of another way."

Through early intervention resources, including family sign classes, Children's Hospital, and support groups, Amy and Bryant were introduced to St. Rita School.

"We knew this was home and where he needed to be," said Amy. "Everyone was talking and signing. We loved the diversity."

"It was hands on. The kids were walking around engaged," said Bryant.

Because of you, a family finds love at the front door

When Amber and Alex adopted 14 month old Eli, it was clear that their family was being fit together by God's hands.

Amber had always wanted to be a part of the deaf community. Watching *Sesame Street* as a 3 year old, Amber remembers learning signs for the first time. That early introduction to sign language led to teaching ballet classes and volunteering at St. Rita School, and later becoming a preschool assistant there as well.

When Amber and Alex made the decision to adopt, they had not quite completed their license to foster when Eli was born. Eli was deaf and Amber and Alex's family was the only family who knew sign language. "It is really cool that the passion for the deaf community stuck with me," said Amber. "I believe it was ultimately to pre-

pare us for our son. It couldn't have worked out any more perfectly than it did. Even the social workers would say that Eli was meant to be with us. It just doesn't happen like that."

Eli had no way to communicate when he came home with Amber and Alex. Immediately, Amber knew that St. Rita School would be the best place for Eli to learn. "St. Rita School just embraced him," said Amber. "He

was such a loner and kept to himself a lot. But over that first year we just watched him embrace sign language and embrace the idea of having friends and that there were people out there that could communicate with him. He started learning and thriving. It was amazing to watch him grow."

"Eli's teachers love him," said Amber. "They work really hard to help him learn and they don't let anything stop his progress. They know the best way to teach him and they are determined to see him succeed."

As Eli began to grow, Amber and Alex welcomed another baby boy into their family. At 5 weeks old, Zion, who could hear was in the Loft Program at St. Rita School. "We wanted him to know sign language and be around the deaf

culture — it's an absolute must for our family. It's so cool to watch him learn sign language. He knows Eli's sign name and they really have a special bond."

"St. Rita School is so special," said Amber. "The attitudes and atmosphere are all about acceptance. It's amazing to work with the kids as they are surrounded by kids that are typical, deaf or apraxic. They may look different or walk different, but it doesn't affect them. They don't judge each other. There are always kids helping each other, holding doors for each other, and no one walks by and leaves someone behind. It doesn't matter what they look like, or what they sound like. They accept each other and love each other. The love just hits you at the door."

"Growing up we knew where the school was, but it was the school for the deaf. When we came here it was like, 'Wait, that kid isn't deaf!' There was so much more."

When Gus started at St. Rita School, he had about 15 intelligible words and 100 signs. Not long after starting at St. Rita School, his signing took off. "He wasn't just learning words though, he was using them to tell us about things, like about the continents," said Bryant. "We just wanted to teach him to communicate, but he was also learning."

"And he had friends," said Amy. "Before it was just the girls next door and his cousins, but now he had

friends who knew and accepted him and could talk to him. He had the self-confidence to interact with other kids as well. He was now willing to talk to others."

Amy and Bryant were so confident in St. Rita School, that they enrolled their son Mac, who is not diagnosed with a communication challenge and just started sending their youngest, Ian, who was recently diagnosed with apraxia.

"You know it's a special school when you can drop your two year old off and walk away and feel good," said Amy. "They love our sons. It has been life changing. We had one little boy trapped inside himself and now he just talks and talks and talks."

"Without St. Rita School, we

wouldn't have our Gus," said Bryant. "I don't even know what life would be like. I can't image where we would be."

As they look forward to watching Ian excel at St. Rita School and Gus and Mac in mainstream school, the boys are having an adventurous fall wrestling, playing football, and just being boys.
